Spokane Humane Society Launches New Hope Program

Will Support Animal Rescue Programs Throughout the Inland Northwest

SPOKANE, WA - To help ensure animals at risk in the Inland Northwest are safely placed into loving homes, the Spokane Humane Society (SHS) has launched its New Hope Program. The new program is designed to help maximize the limited resources of over 80 Inland Northwest animal rescue organizations.

One such partner is the Benton Franklin Humane Society (BFHS). Seven days ago, on Wednesday, November 4th, SHS' New Hope Program rescued 21 cats from BFHS. As of Wednesday, November 11th, 17 of these cats have been vet checked, spayed or neutered and adopted!

the SHS Animal Care Center located at 6607 N. Havana or Bark – a Rescue Pub located at 905 N. Washington today - they are going fast!"

According to Ed Boks, executive director at SHS, "Our New Hope Program is the next step to ensuring the Inland Northwest is among the safest regions in the United States for pets. While SHS hasn't resorted to euthanasia to control pet overpopulation for many years, New Hope provides the support other communities might still need to achieve this life-saving goal."
