Spokane Humane Society to Hold \$25 Spay and Neuter Days Funded by the Summerlee Foundation



Spokane Humane Society will hold \$25 spay/neuter days for low-income individuals thanks to a grant provided by the Summerlee Foundation. On February 13th, we will have 20 available spay and neuter appointments for felines. For canines, we will have four appointments available on February 3, 5, 10, 19, 24, and 26. Spokane Humane Society fervently believes in the

importance of spaying and neutering, not just for the health of the animal, but for the community impact it creates by reducing the number of homeless and neglected animals in the Spokane area. Spaying and neutering can increase life expectancy and reduce unwanted behaviors such as aggression and spraying. Additionally, it is the most successful way to reduce animal overpopulation.

In recent years, there has been a dramatic increase in puppies and kittens that need Spokane Humane Society's services. While spaying and neutering can be costly, utilizing community resources such as the \$25 spay/neuter events, SCRAPS "Spokane County SNIP" day, and Pet Savers' year-round discounted rates can provide more affordable options.
